

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS
for the year ended 25th December 1999

1. **Accounting Policies**

i) **Accounting Convention -**

The accounts of the company are prepared under the historical cost convention and incorporate the results of the principal activity which is described in the directors' report and which is continuing. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 1999).

ii) **Taxation -**

The company's dealings are mainly with its members and the only income currently to fall within the scope of Corporation Tax is the interest earned on the bank deposit account. The company provides for Corporation Tax at rates of 21% and 20% based on the deposit interest received in the year.

iii) **Turnover -**

The turnover represents maintenance levied on each of the 28 flats that are part of the development at Chineham. The company is not registered for VAT.

2. **Turnover**

The turnover and surplus before taxation is attributable to the one principal activity of the company. The turnover all arose from the United Kingdom.

3. **Operating Surplus**

The operating surplus is after charging Auditors' remuneration of £382 (1998 - £353).
